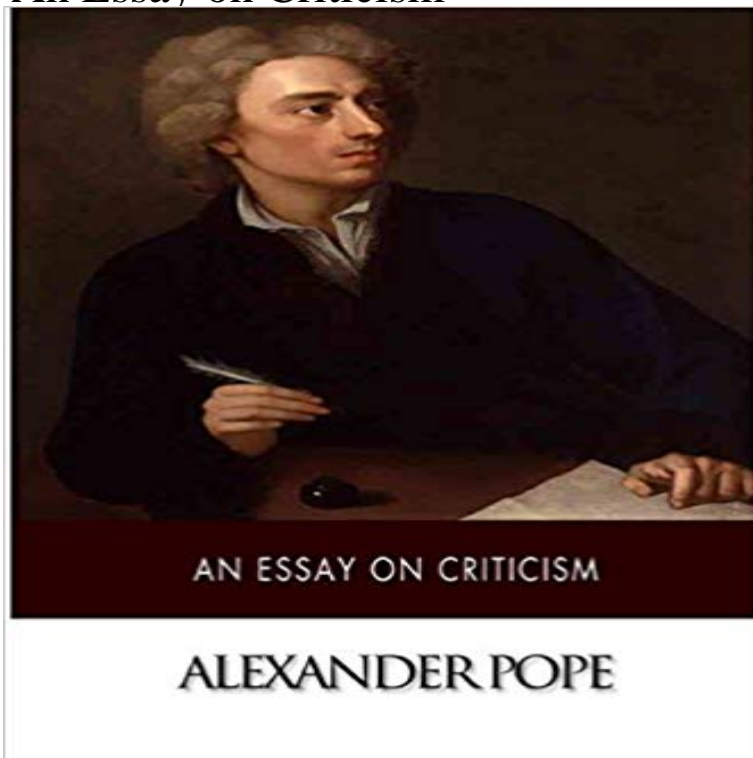


An Essay on Criticism
