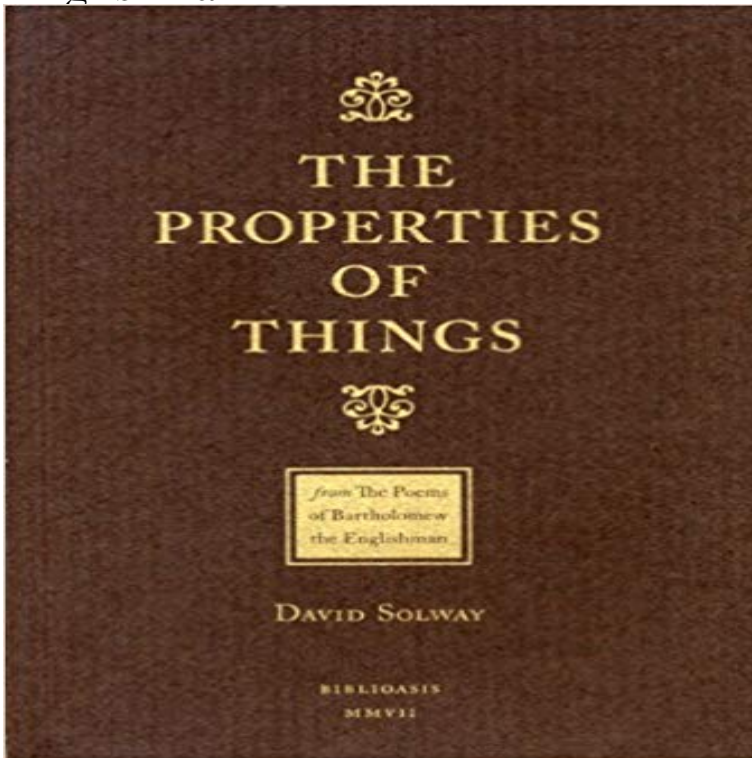


The Properties of Things: From: The Poems of Batholomew the Englishman
