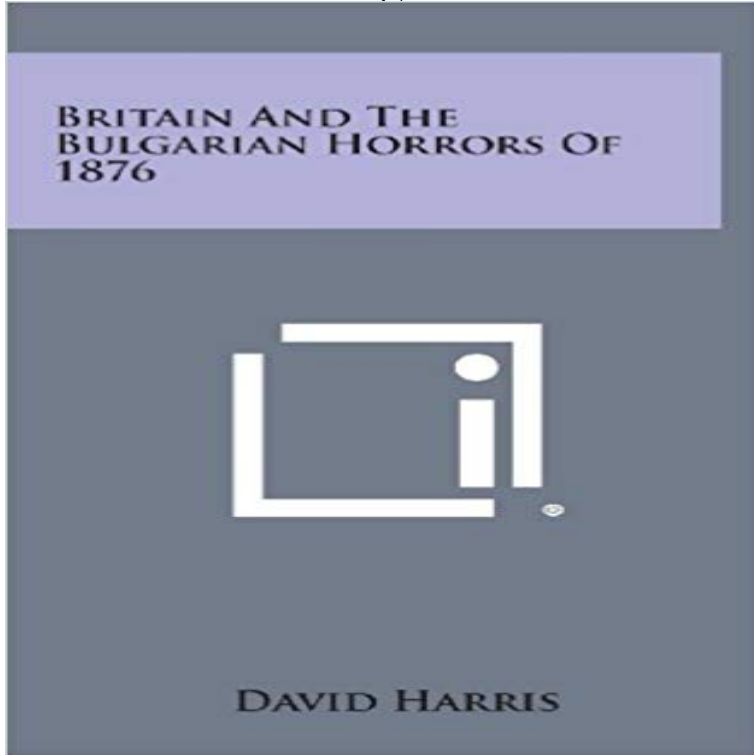

According to British and French figures, 12,000-15,000 Bulgarian civilians were massacred during the uprising.
