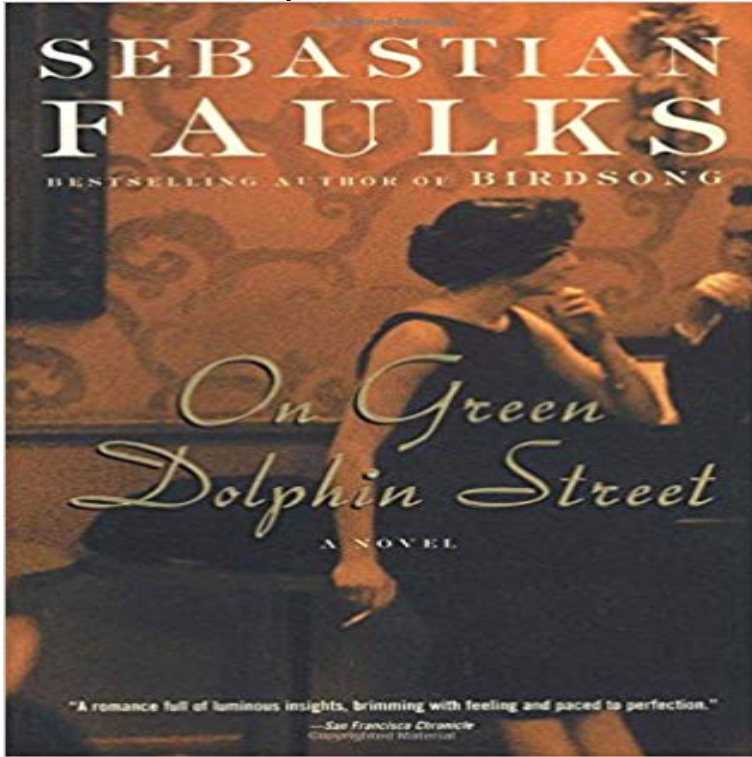


On Green Dolphin Street: A Novel
